SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

Current law exempts cosmetologists from the need for a license when applying makeup to those requiring it for their profession.

This bill permits cosmetology licensees employed outside a licensed establishment to practice their professions on persons performing in theater, movies or television, or on professional models.

SUMMARY

This bill extends the grant-making capacity of the Department of Economic and Community Development under the Economic Opportunity Program, currently limited to municipalities, to local and regional nonprofit organizations.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-23) limits the expansion to the fiscal years 1994-95 and 1995-96 and limits the total amount that may be granted to these organizations to \$200,000.

Current law governing the licensing of counselors "grandfathers" persons who were practicing counseling prior to January 1, 1991. This bill repeals that provision, effective June 30, 1995.

The bill also changes the titles of "licensed clinical professional counselor" and "clinical professional counselor" to "licensed clinical counselor" and "clinical counselor," respectively.
