# SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

# AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill corrects errors and inconsistencies in the statutes, Public Laws, and Resolves.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-322) makes corrections, adds additional sections and removes provisions that are unnecessary or that may have a substantive impact.

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" TO COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-638) adds provisions that may have a substantive effect.

SENATE AMENDMENT "A" TO COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-362) makes a technical correction.

SENATE AMENDMENT "B" TO COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-369) reenacts a provision of the Maine Tort Claims Act concerning liability insurance coverage for employees using their own vehicles for business purposes. It carries out the intent of PL 95, c. 352 (LD 1155, Joint Standing Committee on Banking and Insurance).

This bill would have extended the charitable immunity laws to associations of municipal or other political subdivision officials or officers that are created to educate the members and to create statewide standards of conduct for the members.

#### **SUMMARY**

Under the current civil order of arrest procedure, enforcement of money judgments often takes place where the debtor lives, making it difficult for creditors to appear on short notice. This bill would have permitted a judge or a special disclosure officer to substitute for creditors. The bill also would have

provided that on the second arrest for the same judgment, debtors would be jailed unless they post cash bond. The jailing is not for failure to pay but for failure to appear in the first civil order of arrest process to determine why the debtor has not paid and whether the debtor is able to pay. The bill required that the debtors be warned at the first arrest that this consequence will follow.

The bill establishes a date when an interim report is due and establishes the final report date as December 1, 2000.
