SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

An Act Concerning Cocurricular Activity Eligibility for Students Identified under the Federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act

SUMMARY

This bill provides that a special education student will not be denied eligibility to participate in extracurricular activities because of failure to meet academic eligibility standards or to be enrolled in a certain number or type of classes if that failure is due to the student's exceptionality and the student is in compliance with an individualized education plan.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-137) The amendment replaces the bill. The amendment changes extracurricular to cocurricular and makes a number of technical changes to the bill. The amendment also allows a school administrative unit to use the same eligibility requirements applied to nonexceptional students for exceptional students if an exceptional student is not in compliance with the individual education plan.
