**SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE
THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES**

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

LD 871**An Act Concerning the Calculation of Private Fire Protection Charges**

This bill proposes to allow water utilities to establish rates for private fire protection that include recovery for a portion of the costs of the utilities' backup facilities, including mains, storage facilities and pumps.

AMENDMENTS ADOPTED**SUMMARY**

This bill proposed to require telephone utilities to install and maintain at cost modern telecommunication links to public schools. The bill proposed to require up to 2 links to be installed, upon the request of a school board, to secondary schools and one link to be installed, upon the request of a school board, to elementary schools. The bill proposed to permit schools and telephone utilities to petition the Public Utilities Commission to resolve any disputes arising from these provisions.

This bill proposed to

1. Permit electric utilities to enter into contracts and to sell power to business entities in this State without review by the Public Utilities Commission;
2. Permit the Governor to require an electric utility to provide retail wheeling services to a business entity; and
3. Permit a utility to charge a fee for its transmission and wheeling services to cover direct costs only.

AMENDMENTS ADOPTED**SUMMARY**

This bill proposed to change the effect of a law which was amended in 1984 concerning utility prescriptive rights to land through adverse possession.

Pre-1984, 35-A MRSA §2488 prohibited utilities from obtaining prescriptive easements on land on which their facilities are located.
