# SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

## AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

#### An Act to Revise Reapportionment Guidelines

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill directed the Legislative Apportionment Commission to consider certain geographic guidelines when reapportioning state legislative districts. The guidelines were intended to supplement the Constitution of Maine.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-437) made the Supreme Judicial Court subject to the same statutory provisions as the Legislative Apportionment Commission when it was required to make the apportionment. It also added "oceans" to the definition of "functionally contiguous and compact territory" and required that the commission and the court give weight to the interests of local communities in making their boundary decisions.

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill would have clarified that the failure of a clerk of a municipality to meet the statutory and constitutional requirements of petition verification and certification was not sufficient cause to invalidate a petition, if petition circulators and signers met their statutory and constitutional requirements. It would have also required the Secretary of State to specifically notify the applicant of the petition and the clerk when verification and certification errors were made, and would have required that the Secretary of State return the petitions to the clerk who made the error for correction.

The minority COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-309) would have added a fiscal note to the bill.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-155) replaced the bill. It made auxiliary licenses for golf courses subject to the same provisions as auxiliary licenses for ski areas and added a fiscal note. It also required all auxiliary licensees to be properly equipped with restrooms.
