SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill creates the honorary office of State Poet Laureate and describes the appointment process and the duties of the State Poet Laureate. As this is an honorary position, the holder of the office is permitted to seek, accept or serve as an elected or appointed state or local government employee while serving as State Poet Laureate.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-350) changes the membership of the State Poet Laureate Selection Advisory Panel by eliminating from the panel the chairs of the English departments of each of the campuses of the University of Maine System and replacing them with one representative of the University of Maine System, one representative of private universities and colleges and one representative of public school English teachers. This amendment adds a provision requiring each panel member to survey the colleagues the member represents for the names of candidates to be considered by the full panel for recommendation to the Governor. This amendment also makes technical changes to the bill and adds a fiscal note.
