SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill allows the Director of the Maine Historic Preservation Commission to designate and post archaeological sites against unauthorized excavation on public property with the permission of the landowner. Existing law already requires landowner permission for posting of private property. This bill also modifies the definition of excavation to more fully protect maritime archaeological sites.

SUMMARY

This bill provides for the continuation of the Maine Committee for Global Education past its scheduled sunset on June 30, 1995. The committee is authorized to make grants to elementary and secondary schools for the purpose of improving student and teacher skills and knowledge for living and working in the global economy.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-396) makes changes to the membership of the Maine Committee for Global Education, changes the name of the committee to the Maine Committee for Global and Geographic Education and makes minor changes to the duties of the committee. The amendment designates the Maine Geographic Alliance as the fiscal and administrative agent for the committee.

The amendment adds an appropriation of \$60,000 from the General Fund to be matched by a grant of the same amount from the National Geographic Society. The amendment also adds a fiscal note.

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" TO COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-507) clarifies that the Chair of the Legislative Council must convene the first meeting of the Maine Committee for Global and Geographic Education no later than August 1, 1995.

SENATE AMENDMENT "A" TO COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (\$-391) This amendment reduces the amount of General Fund appropriations provided for grants to \$5,000 in fiscal year 1995-96.
