**SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE
THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES**

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

AMENDMENTS ADOPTED**SUMMARY**

This bill allows certain registered nurses to be designated as advanced practice registered nurses.

Advanced practice registered nurses include certified nurse practitioners, certified nurse midwives, certified clinical nurse specialists and certified nurse anesthetists. Under this bill, except for certified clinical nurse specialists, advanced practice registered nurses must work in collaboration with a physician. They are not allowed to prescribe medication.

SUMMARY

This bill accomplishes the following.

1. The bill amends the per diem salary for members of the State Board of Substance Abuse Counselors to be consistent with other professional regulatory boards.
2. The bill changes references to the Manufactured Housing Board to the Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation and the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation in order to be in accordance with federal requirements regarding manufactured housing boards.
3. The bill makes minor technical changes to the laws governing hearing aid dealers and fitters.
4. The bill corrects gender references, eliminates the need for notarized applications and sets a reasonable fee for replacement of lost licenses in the laws concerning the licensing of arborists.
5. The bill amends the accountancy laws to allow the Board of Accountancy to consider other examinations for certification than those currently specified in law.
6. The bill amends the real estate appraisal laws by replacing the specified educational licensing requirements with requirements set by the appraisal qualification board of the appraisal foundation.
7. The bill clarifies that courses for the continuing education requirement for license renewal as a professional land surveyor may be in surveying practice or in other related courses to the practice of surveying.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-449) accomplishes the following.

1. It requires the Board of Dental Examiners to make a report by February 1, 1996 to the Joint Standing Committee on Business and Economic Development concerning the licensure of denturists.
2. It requires sellers of heating equipment to report to the Oil and Solid Fuel Board the make, model and serial number of equipment sold if requested by the board.
