SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

This bill would have required that motor vehicles that have been crushed as part of their disposal process may only be transported on a public way if enclosed on all sides in a solid enclosure.

SUMMARY

This bill creates the Northern New England Passenger Rail Authority for the general purpose of promoting passenger rail service. This authority is the successor in interest to the Department of Transportation in promoting this service.

The bill authorizes the transfer of existing funds reserved for railroad improvements in Private and Special Law 1991, chapter 113, Part B, section 6 to the authority.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-202) adds a fiscal note to the bill.

This bill would have made changes in state laws relating to the rights and responsibilities of public officers, landowners and members of the public with regard to municipal ways and other rights of public and private access.

SUMMARY

This bill would repeal the Board of Commercial Driver Education and would relieve the Department of Education of its responsibility to regulate the provisions of driver education in school settings. The bill would also transfer oversight and rule-making authority for all driver education programs to the Secretary of State.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-331) makes several technical changes to the bill. It clarifies the distinction between commercial driver education school and noncommercial driver education school. It clarifies that a licensed driver education teacher or instructor is authorized to teach driver education as an employee or affiliate of a licensed driver education school. It reduces the proposed examination fee for a Class C operator's license examination from \$15 to \$12. Currently, a Class C license exam is \$10. This amendment also adds transition provisions, allocation sections and a fiscal note to the bill. (See bill summary LD 446).

SUMMARY

This resolve would have created a special commemorative simulated motor vehicle registration plate in celebration of the 175th anniversary of the establishment of the State of Maine. The plate would have been designed and issued by the Secretary of State and displayed during the rest of 1995 and 1996 in place of the front registration plate on most motor vehicles. Revenue generated by sale of the plate in excess of the cost of production and issuance would have been divided equally among the state cultural agencies.

LD 1323 An Act to Widen the Maine Turnpike

SUMMARY

This bill proposed a referendum for voters to approve widening of the Maine Turnpike.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-282) allows widening of the Maine Turnpike to 3 lanes for each direction of travel from Exit 1 to, and including, Exit 6A. It requires the Maine Turnpike Authority to complete an evaluation of alternatives by December 15, 1996 and specifies that evaluating the alternatives listed satisfies the requirements for alternative evaluation under the Sensible Transportation Policy Act and rules adopted under the Act. It allows a state agency to issue a permit or license for the widening if the completed evaluation indicates alternatives will not meet the identified need.

It requires the Maine Turnpike Authority to submit an interim report on the alternatives evaluation no later than January 15, 1996. It allows the authority to submit legislation no later than January 15, 1996 to authorize the issuance of revenue bonds to pay for the widening.
