#### RE: BILL SUMMARIES, 119th LEGISLATURE, 2nd REGULAR SESSION

Enclosed please find a summary of all bills, resolves, joint study orders, joint resolutions and Constitutional resolutions that were considered by the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs during the 2nd Regular Session of the 119th Legislature. The summary describes each bill or order and relevant amendments as well as the final action. Also included is a statistical summary of bill activity by the committee. Please note the effective date for all non-emergency legislation enacted in the 2nd Regular Session (unless a later date is specified in a particular law) is August 11, 2000. Joint Orders are effective when passed.

The bill summaries for your committee also include 4 bills that, although discussed in work sessions, were never referred. LD's 2589, 2646, 2664 and 2692 were discussed as part of your committee process and are therefore included in this document for your information.

The document is organized for convenient reference to information on bills handled by the committee this session. It is organized by bill (LD) number and two indices are located at the back of the document that group bills by subject and by LD number. Final action on each bill is noted to the right of the bill title. The abbreviations used for various categories of final action are as follows:

LD 135 proposed a bond issue in the amount of \$25,000,000 that would have been used by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to improve and expand fish hatcheries.

#### LD 154 An Act to Provide Funding to the Maine Center for the Blind and P & S 92 Visually Impaired

LD 154 proposed to appropriate \$90,000 and \$60,000 to the Department of Labor in fiscal years 1999-00 and 2000-01, respectively, for the establishment of an audio information service for people who are blind or visually impaired and other people in the State who are unable to access printed information due to a disability.

**Committee Amendment ''A '' (H-772)** proposed to eliminate the original request in fiscal year 1999-00 of \$90,000 and lower the original request for fiscal year 2000-01 from \$60,000 to \$45,000.

The fiscal year 2000-01 appropriation would be used by the Maine Center for the Blind and Visually Impaired, in conjunction with the Maine Public Broadcasting Corporation, to fund a program, Maine Airs, that would have daily and weekly newspapers read for listening by the more than 12,000 residents of the State who are print-disabled.

This amendment also proposed to clarify that this funding is provided on a one-time basis and would have required the Department of Labor to report back to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs on the status of the program.

#### Enacted Law Summary:

Private and Special Law 1999, chapter 92 provides a one-time General Fund appropriation of \$45,000 in fiscal year 2000-01 for the Department of Labor to establish an audio information service through the Maine Center for the Blind and Visually Impaired for people who are blind or visually impaired and other people in the State who are unable to access printed information due to a disability. The Department of Labor is also required to submit a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs on the status of the Maine Airs program by February 2, 2001.
