BILL SUMMARIES, 119th LEGISLATURE, 2nd REGULAR SESSION

Enclosed please find a summary of all bills, resolves, joint study orders, joint resolutions and Constitutional resolutions that were considered by the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs during the 2nd Regular Session of the 119th Legislature. The summary describes each bill or order and relevant amendments as well as the final action. Also included is a statistical summary of bill activity by the committee. Please note the effective date for all non-emergency legislation enacted in the 2nd Regular Session (unless a later date is specified in a particular law) is August 11, 2000. Joint Orders are effective when passed.

The bill summaries for your committee also include 4 bills that, although discussed in work sessions, were never referred. LD's 2589, 2646, 2664 and 2692 were discussed as part of your committee process and are therefore included in this document for your information.

The document is organized for convenient reference to information on bills handled by the committee this session. It is organized by bill (LD) number and two indices are located at the back of the document that group bills by subject and by LD number. Final action on each bill is noted to the right of the bill title. The abbreviations used for various categories of final action are as follows:

LD 191 proposed to provide a General Fund appropriation of \$25,000 in each of fiscal years 1999-00 and 2000-01 for the Department of Economic and Community Development to support the visitor centers in the Town of Bethel and the Town of Fryeburg.

LD 269 An Act to Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue for the Repair and Renovation of Schools

LD 269 proposed to do the following:

Part A proposed a bond issue in the amount of \$35,000,000 that would have been used by the Department of Education for renovation and repair of Maine public schools.

Part B of this bill proposed to appropriate \$10,000,000 to the Department of Education, School Renovation program for school renovations and repairs.

While this bill was reported Ought Not to Pass, a General Fund appropriation for school renovations of \$27,000,000 in fiscal year 2000-01 was included in Public Law 1999, Chapter 731, Part A.

LD 271 An Act to Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue in the Amount of \$25,000,000 to Build or Rehabilitate Regional Psychiatric Facilities

LD 271 proposed a bond issue in the amount of \$25,000,000 that would have been used to construct or rehabilitate regional psychiatric facilities.

While this bill was reported Ought Not to Pass, authorization for the Maine Governmental Facilities Authority to issue securities up to \$33,000,000 for the purpose of paying the cost associated with the psychiatric treatment facility in Augusta was included in Public Law 1999, Chapter 731, Part NNN.

LD 462 An Act to Require That All Fines Collected by State Agencies Be Deposited in the General Fund

LD 462 proposed to require the Treasurer of State to deposit all fines, penalties and forfeitures received by all state departments and agencies into the General Fund.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-813) proposed to replace the bill. It proposed to amend several sections in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38 relating to revenue from fines, forfeitures and penalties that are dedicated to several funds within the Department of Environmental Protection. Those revenues would have accrued to the General Fund effective July 1, 2001.

This amendment also proposed to require the Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services to report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs by December 1, 2000 with a listing of all dedicated fines, forfeitures and penalties and implementing legislation to credit those dedicated revenues to the General Fund. The amendment also proposed to allow the commissioner to exclude from the legislation certain dedicated fines if a justification was included in the report for each fine, forfeiture or penalty excluded.

LD 516 An Act to Restore and Improve Family Planning and Pregnancy Prevention Services

LD 516 proposed to provide General Fund appropriations totaling \$1,000,000 during the 2000-2001 biennium for the Department of Human Services to purchase family planning and pregnancy prevention services.

LD 807 proposed to establish a General Fund reserve fund. The fund would have been used to cover actual or projected General Fund revenue shortfalls in any state fiscal year; for prepayment of outstanding General Fund bonds; for prepayment of any unfunded liabilities of the Maine State Retirement System related to state government employees or teachers; and for major construction projects exceeding \$1,000,000.
