RE: BILL SUMMARIES, 119th LEGISLATURE, 2nd REGULAR SESSION

Enclosed please find a summary of all bills, resolves, joint study orders, joint resolutions and Constitutional resolutions that were considered by the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs during the 2nd Regular Session of the 119th Legislature. The summary describes each bill or order and relevant amendments as well as the final action. Also included is a statistical summary of bill activity by the committee. Please note the effective date for all non-emergency legislation enacted in the 2nd Regular Session (unless a later date is specified in a particular law) is August 11, 2000. Joint Orders are effective when passed.

The bill summaries for your committee also include 4 bills that, although discussed in work sessions, were never referred. LD's 2589, 2646, 2664 and 2692 were discussed as part of your committee process and are therefore included in this document for your information.

The document is organized for convenient reference to information on bills handled by the committee this session. It is organized by bill (LD) number and two indices are located at the back of the document that group bills by subject and by LD number. Final action on each bill is noted to the right of the bill title. The abbreviations used for various categories of final action are as follows:

Committee Amendment ''A'' (H-780) proposed to provide a position-legislative count of 3.000, to revise the personal services amount to \$90,416 and to clarify that the new position established in the resolve is an Account Clerk II position.

LD 2337Resolve, to Provide Funds to Assist in the Expansion of the MaineDIED ONVeterans' Memorial Cemetery SystemADJOURNMENT

LD 2337 proposed to implement one of the recommendations of the Committee to Study Standardized Periods of Military Service and Other Matters Related to the Award of State of Maine Veterans' Benefits. It would have provided a General Fund appropriation of \$65,000 in fiscal year 2000-01 to the Department of Defense, Veterans' and Emergency Management for additional operating funds for the Maine Veterans' Memorial Cemetery System to support expansion of the system.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-775) proposed to add a fiscal note to the resolve.

While this bill died on adjournment, a working capital advance of \$100,000 was provided in fiscal year 2000-01 in Public Law 1999, chapter 731, Part DDD for the Department of Defense, Veterans' and Emergency Management to establish the Northern Maine Veterans' Cemetery.

LD 2343 proposed a one-time General Fund appropriation of \$4,500,000 to the Maine State Housing Authority for the Low-income Home Energy Assistance Program in anticipation of a projected shortfall during the 1999-2000 winter season.

Committee Amendment ''A'' (H-841) proposed to create the Task Force to Reduce the Burden of Home Heating Costs on Low-income Households and included a General Fund appropriation of \$5,720 to the Legislature in fiscal year 2000-01 for expenses of the task force.

House Amendment "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-977) proposed to limit the authority of the task force to reporting out a "bill" rather than "legislation." This amendment also proposed that submission of the report is "for" rather than "to" the 120th Legislature.

Senate Amendment "A" to Committee Amendment "A" (S-773) proposed to clarify the appointment of members to the Task Force to Reduce the Burden of Home Heating Costs on Low-income Households and proposed to reduce the General Fund appropriation to the Legislature by \$3,540 in fiscal year 2000-01.

Enacted Law Summary:

Resolve 1999, chapter 132 establishes the Task Force to Reduce the Burden of Home Heating Costs on Lowincome Households and provides a General Fund appropriation of \$2,180 in fiscal year 2000-01 for the Legislature for the expenses of the task force.

Chapter 132 was finally passed as an emergency measure effective May 10, 2000.

LD 2347 proposed to require the Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services and the Commissioner of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services to report back to the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs regarding the results of a programming study, feasibility planning and design work for a new forensic unit to provide assistance to the mentally ill. It also proposed to require the commissioners to additionally report, by February 29, 2000, the results to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services.

While this bill was reported Ought Not to Pass, authorization for the Maine Governmental Facilities Authority to issue securities up to \$33,000,000 for the purpose of paying the cost associated with the psychiatric treatment facility in Augusta was included in Public Law 1999, Chapter 731, Part NNN.

LD 2367An Act to Provide for Safety in the Maine Conservation CorpsP & S 88EMERGENCY

LD 2367 proposed to provide for the safety of participants, volunteers and staff of the Maine Conservation Corps by providing a General Fund appropriation of \$89,994 in fiscal year 2000-01 for safety-related equipment and training and a safety and training officer position.

Committee Amendment ''A'' (S-568) proposed to provide a General Fund appropriation of \$34,052 and \$20,757 in fiscal years 1999-00 and 2000-01, respectively, for the Department of Labor to purchase safety related equipment for the Maine Conservation Corps program. The amendment also proposed to add an emergency preamble, emergency clause and a fiscal note to the bill.
