BILL SUMMARIES, 119th LEGISLATURE, 2nd REGULAR SESSION

Enclosed please find a summary of all bills, resolves, joint study orders, joint resolutions and Constitutional resolutions that were considered by the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs during the 2nd Regular Session of the 119th Legislature. The summary describes each bill or order and relevant amendments as well as the final action. Also included is a statistical summary of bill activity by the committee. Please note the effective date for all non-emergency legislation enacted in the 2nd Regular Session (unless a later date is specified in a particular law) is August 11, 2000. Joint Orders are effective when passed.

The bill summaries for your committee also include 4 bills that, although discussed in work sessions, were never referred. LD's 2589, 2646, 2664 and 2692 were discussed as part of your committee process and are therefore included in this document for your information.

The document is organized for convenient reference to information on bills handled by the committee this session. It is organized by bill (LD) number and two indices are located at the back of the document that group bills by subject and by LD number. Final action on each bill is noted to the right of the bill title. The abbreviations used for various categories of final action are as follows:

Enacted Law Summary:

Private and Special Law 1999, chapter 100 provides a one-time General Fund appropriation of \$171,000 in fiscal year 1999-00 to the Department of Education to be applied toward a principal payment remaining on a \$3,000,000 dormitory at the Maine School of Science and Mathematics.

Chapter 100 was enacted as an emergency measure effective May 18, 2000.

LD 2399 An Act to Designate a Poison Control Center and to Adequately Fund Poison Control Services

LD 2399 proposed to provide a General Fund appropriation of \$255,000 in fiscal year 2000-01 for the Department of Human Services to fund poison control services.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-849) proposed to designate the Maine Poison Center as the official poison control center in the State, encourage the center to achieve certification from a national association of poison control centers prior to May 1, 2003, require the center to do so by December 1, 2004 and require the center to pursue alternative funding sources to fully support the level of services it offers. It also proposed to require the center to report on its progress in pursuing alternative funding sources and the status of its efforts to achieve certification to the joint standing committees of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs and health and human services matters no later than February 15, 2001.

This amendment would have clarified that the Maine Poison Center must seek funding from other sources and also would have added a fiscal note to the bill.

While this bill was indefinitely postponed, a General Fund appropriation of \$255,000 in fiscal year 2000-01 was included in Public Law 1999, Chapter 731, Part YYY.

LD 2402 Resolve, to Promote Maine's Dairy Industry

LD 2402 proposed to provide an allocation of \$30,000 in fiscal year 2000-01 from the Maine Dairy Stabilization Fund to the Maine Dairy Industry Association to allow it to retain the services of a spokesperson to represent the Maine dairy industry.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-858) proposed to change the bill to a resolve. It proposed to add a section to the bill that requires the Maine Dairy Industry Association to report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over agriculture matters by November 1, 2000 on the interest of the State's dairy farmers to form a cooperative association. It also proposed to reduce the allocation to \$10,000 and provide these funds in fiscal year 1999-00. The amendment proposed to add a fiscal note, an emergency preamble and an emergency clause.

Senate Amendment "A" to Committee Amendment "A" (S-562) proposed to increase the allocation to the Maine Milk Commission to \$30,000 from \$10,000.

Enacted Law Summary:

Resolve 1999, chapter 105 allocates \$30,000 from the Maine Dairy Stabilization Fund on a one-time basis in fiscal year 1999-00 to the Maine Milk Commission for outreach efforts through the Maine Dairy Industry Association to assess the interest of the State's dairy farmers in forming a cooperative association. It also requires the Maine Dairy Industry Association to report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over agriculture matters by November 1, 2000 on the interest of the state dairy farmers to form a cooperative association.

Chapter 105 was finally passed as an emergency measure effective April 10, 2000.
