BILL SUMMARIES, 119th LEGISLATURE, 2nd REGULAR SESSION

Enclosed please find a summary of all bills, resolves, joint study orders, joint resolutions and Constitutional resolutions that were considered by the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs during the 2nd Regular Session of the 119th Legislature. The summary describes each bill or order and relevant amendments as well as the final action. Also included is a statistical summary of bill activity by the committee. Please note the effective date for all non-emergency legislation enacted in the 2nd Regular Session (unless a later date is specified in a particular law) is August 11, 2000. Joint Orders are effective when passed.

The bill summaries for your committee also include 4 bills that, although discussed in work sessions, were never referred. LD's 2589, 2646, 2664 and 2692 were discussed as part of your committee process and are therefore included in this document for your information.

The document is organized for convenient reference to information on bills handled by the committee this session. It is organized by bill (LD) number and two indices are located at the back of the document that group bills by subject and by LD number. Final action on each bill is noted to the right of the bill title. The abbreviations used for various categories of final action are as follows:

LD 2483 proposed to provide a General Fund appropriation of \$200,000 in fiscal year 2000-01 to increase the Maine State Library's acquisition budget to the level of the other Area Reference and Resource Centers located at the Bangor and Portland public libraries and allow the Maine State Library to continue to purchase books, magazines and on-line products essential to the library's statewide role as a research facility and information provider.

While this bill was indefinitely postponed, a General Fund appropriation for this purpose of \$200,000 in fiscal year 2000-01 was included in Public Law 1999, Chapter 731, Part A-1.

LD 2492 proposed to appropriate \$78,855 and \$163,937 in fiscal years 1999-00 and 2000-01, respectively, to the Department of Education to increase the state subsidy for adult education.

Committee Amendment "A" (**H-848**) proposed to strike the appropriation section of the bill and replace it with a new appropriation section and an allocation section. The new sections would organize "Adult Education" into a separate program within the Department of Education and provide a 3% increase in funding in fiscal year 1999-00 and fiscal year 2000-01. It also proposed to add a fiscal note to the bill.

Senate Amendment "A "to Committee Amendment "A " (S-756) proposed to eliminate the appropriations and allocations in fiscal year 2000-01 and provide a General Fund appropriation of \$78,855 in fiscal year 1999-00 only.

Enacted Law Summary:

Private and Special Law 1999, chapter 96 provides a General Fund appropriation of \$78,855 in fiscal year 1999-00 for the Department of Education, Adult Education program to increase the state subsidy for adult education.

Chapter 96 was enacted as an emergency measure effective May 10, 2000.
