RE: BILL SUMMARIES, 119th LEGISLATURE, 2nd REGULAR SESSION

Enclosed please find a summary of all bills, resolves, joint study orders, joint resolutions and Constitutional resolutions that were considered by the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs during the 2nd Regular Session of the 119th Legislature. The summary describes each bill or order and relevant amendments as well as the final action. Also included is a statistical summary of bill activity by the committee. Please note the effective date for all non-emergency legislation enacted in the 2nd Regular Session (unless a later date is specified in a particular law) is August 11, 2000. Joint Orders are effective when passed.

The bill summaries for your committee also include 4 bills that, although discussed in work sessions, were never referred. LD's 2589, 2646, 2664 and 2692 were discussed as part of your committee process and are therefore included in this document for your information.

The document is organized for convenient reference to information on bills handled by the committee this session. It is organized by bill (LD) number and two indices are located at the back of the document that group bills by subject and by LD number. Final action on each bill is noted to the right of the bill title. The abbreviations used for various categories of final action are as follows:

House Amendment "A" (H-912) proposed to strike the emergency preamble and clause and change the fiscal year for which the appropriation is provided.

House Amendment "B" to Committee Amendment "A" (H-968) proposed to change the source of the funds for the rebate of the excise taxes on diesel fuel from the General Fund to the Highway Fund.

LD 2572 proposed to provide General Fund appropriations totaling \$4,222,000 in fiscal year 2000-01 to cover the cost of the waiver of tuition, fees and other expenses for students who are Native Americans in the Maine Technical College System, the University of Maine System and the Maine Maritime Academy.

LD 2589 An Act to Appropriate Matching Funds for the Study of INDEF PP Nondefense Uses of the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard

LD 2589 proposed to provide a General Fund appropriation of \$50,000 in fiscal year 2000-01 to match funds to provide for an evaluation of the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard to determine the utility of the facilities and technologies available at the shipyard for use by private sector industries for nondefense-related projects. The evaluation would have been conducted by the Southern Maine Economic Development District in coordination with the Department of Economic and Community Development, the Economic Development Administration, and the Town of Kittery, among others. At the completion of the evaluation, the same group would have been required to develop a marketing plan to advertise the assets available at the shipyard and in the Town of Kittery.

While this bill was indefinitely postponed, General Fund appropriations for this purpose were included in Private and Special Law 1999, Chapter 99.

LD 2598An Act to Enhance Teacher Development and Meet the SpecialDIED BETWEENNeeds of Students at the Southern Maine Juvenile FacilityHOUSES

LD 2598 proposed to make an appropriation to the Southern Maine Juvenile Facility to enhance teacher development and meet special educational needs of students at the facility. Specifically, the bill proposed to provide \$100,000 for professional development in special education and alternative education, \$39,794 for an additional special education teacher and \$75,000 for tutors and short-term substitutes necessary to address the educational needs of students when the student population is at maximum capacity.

Committee Amendment ''A'' (H-900) proposed to replace the bill and include an appropriation section to provide funding to the Southern Maine Juvenile Facility to enhance teacher development and meet the special educational needs of students at the facility. Specifically, the amendment proposed to provide \$100,000 for professional development in special education and alternative education, \$39,794 for an additional special education teacher and \$75,000 for substitute teachers necessary to address the educational needs of students when the student population is at maximum capacity.

House Amendment "A" to Committee Amendment "A" (H-919) proposed to maintain the same funding contained in the committee amendment but also provide funding for 2 part-time teacher positions and one teacher aide position due to a loss of federal funding. It also proposed to add an emergency preamble and an emergency clause to the amendment.

LD 2609 Resolve, to Ensure Adequate Funding for the Lewiston District RESOLVE 120 Court

LD 2609 proposed to authorize the Maine Governmental Facilities Authority to issue additional securities in the amount of \$2,000,000 to replace the Lewiston District Court. This authorization would be in addition to the \$5,000,000 previously approved. The additional authority would be needed to meet increased construction costs and to provide an expansion in the size of the facility.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-561) proposed to add an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the resolve.

Senate Amendment ''A'' to Committee Amendment ''A'' (S-708) proposed to specify that the Maine Governmental Facilities Authority may issue additional securities on or after July 1, 2001. The amendment also proposed to strike the appropriation section.

Enacted Law Summary:

Resolve 1999, chapter 120 authorizes the Maine Governmental Facilities Authority to issue additional securities in its own name in the amount of \$2,000,000 on or after July 1, 2001 to replace the Lewiston District Court.
