Summary Of Legislation Before The Joint Standing Committees August 2001

Enclosed please find a summary of all bills, resolves, joint study orders, joint resolutions and Constitutional resolutions that were considered by the joint standing select committees of the Maine Legislature this past session. The document is a compilation of bill summaries which describe each bill and relevant amendments, as well as the final action taken. Also included are statistical summaries of bill activity this session for the Legislature and each of its joint standing committees.

The document is organized for convenient reference to information on bills considered by the committees. It is organized by committees and within committees by bill (LD) number. The committee report(s), prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor(s), if designated, are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed by paper number. Two indices, a subject index and a numerical index by LD number are provided for easy reference to bills. They are located at the back of the document. A separate publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, may also be helpful in providing information on the disposition of bills. These bill summaries also are available at the Law and Legislative Reference Library and on the Internet (www.state.me.us/legis/opla).

Final action on each bill is noted to the right of the bill title. The abbreviations used for various categories of final action are as follows:

LD 234 **An Act Regarding Hunts of Nuisance Animals ONTP** Sponsor(s) Committee Report Amendments Adopted DAVIS P **ONTP SCHNEIDER** LD 234 proposed to allow only people whose land was open for hunting to obtain written permission from a game warden to employ agents to take and kill nuisance animals. This bill proposed to require people whose land was closed to hunting to apply to the game warden for a hunt to be conducted using hunters chosen by lottery. This bill also proposed to require the landowner to donate any excess carcasses after the first 2 carcasses of deer taken or killed to the Hunters for the Hungry Program.
