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# LEGISLATIVE DIGEST OF BILLS AND SUMMARIES OF ENACTED LAWS

This Legislative Digest of Bills and Summaries of Enacted Laws provides the disposition of all LDs and summaries of all laws enacted or finally passed during the First Regular and First Special Sessions of the 131st Maine Legislature. Please note that all LDs and proposed amendments may be found through the Legislature's webpage, and each includes a summary of what the bill or amendment proposed.

The Legislative Digest of Bills and Summaries of Enacted Laws is arranged alphabetically by committee. Within each committee section is a subject index of all LDs considered by that committee as well as a digest of the LDs, arranged by LD number. Also included are enacted law summaries of the LDs enacted or finally passed. Brief analyst notes on certain LDs are also included: a committee digest will indicate if additional notes are provided for an LD. These notes add information staff found useful and may provide useful information to users of this Digest; please note that most LDs do not have a note and lack of a note should not be interpreted as having any significance. A separate section of the Digest provides a digest of the relatively few LDs that were not referred to a committee or reported from a committee as a committee bill; enacted law summaries of the LDs enacted or finally passed are provided. Finally, an appendix provides a summary of relevant session statistics.

The final disposition of each LD is noted in the relevant summary digest and index. The following describes the various final actions.

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for no more than five years and whose certificate was in good standing and has lapsed. The professional teacher certificate must be issued with the same grades and subject area endorsements as were issued with the active professional teacher certificate that was held by the teacher at the time of the teacher's retirement. Both certificates must be issued for the same period and subject to the same renewal standards as regular certificates. The State Board of Education is authorized to further govern qualifications of both certificates through rulemaking.

### LD 830 Resolve, Directing the Maine Community College System to Study Providing On-Campus Housing on All Campuses

#### **ENACTED LAW SUMMARY**

Resolve 2023, chapter 17 directs the Maine Community College System to study providing oncampus housing for students, focusing in particular on campuses that do not offer housing currently. The system must consider the cost of constructing housing, available space on campuses, the cost to students, other infrastructure and staff that would be necessary to support housing, alternate housing options and any other issues the system feels are appropriate. The system must report its findings and any suggested legislation to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs no later than December 6, 2023.

## LD 867 An Act Regarding Undesignated Ready-to-Use Glucagon Rescue Therapies in Schools

#### **ENACTED LAW SUMMARY**

Public Law 2023, chapter 253 allows a public school, public charter school or approved private school to obtain a standing order for undesignated ready-to-use glucagon rescue therapy. It provides that only a school nurse or unlicensed school personnel who have completed the training required by rule to administer medication may administer glucagon to a student. Public Law 2023, chapter 253 also provides procedures for the storage and administration of undesignated glucagon in a public school, public charter school or approved private school.

## LD 873 An Act to Continue the Department of Education Diploma Program Related to the COVID-19 Pandemic

#### **ENACTED LAW SUMMARY**

Public Law 2023, chapter 171 changes the date of the repeal of student eligibility for a Department of Education diploma due to interruption as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic to September 1, 2026.

Public Law 2023, chapter 171 was enacted as an emergency measure effective June 15, 2023.
