LEGISLATIVE DIGEST OF BILLS AND SUMMARIES OF ENACTED LAWS

This Legislative Digest of Bills and Summaries of Enacted Laws provides the disposition of all LDs and summaries of all laws enacted or finally passed during the First Regular and First Special Sessions of the 131st Maine Legislature. Please note that all LDs and proposed amendments may be found through the Legislature's webpage, and each includes a summary of what the bill or amendment proposed.

The Legislative Digest of Bills and Summaries of Enacted Laws is arranged alphabetically by committee. Within each committee section is a subject index of all LDs considered by that committee as well as a digest of the LDs, arranged by LD number. Also included are enacted law summaries of the LDs enacted or finally passed. Brief analyst notes on certain LDs are also included: a committee digest will indicate if additional notes are provided for an LD. These notes add information staff found useful and may provide useful information to users of this Digest; please note that most LDs do not have a note and lack of a note should not be interpreted as having any significance. A separate section of the Digest provides a digest of the relatively few LDs that were not referred to a committee or reported from a committee as a committee bill; enacted law summaries of the LDs enacted or finally passed are provided. Finally, an appendix provides a summary of relevant session statistics.

The final disposition of each LD is noted in the relevant summary digest and index. The following describes the various final actions.

JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE ON STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT

LD 1934 Resolve, to Improve the Coordination and Delivery of Planning Grants and Technical Assistance to Communities in Maine

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 51 requires the Office of Policy Innovation and the Future to review opportunities and structural changes in the organization of State Government that will result in the improved coordination and implementation of planning grants and technical assistance programs for Maine communities and regional planning and development organizations. The office must conduct the review in consultation with diverse stakeholders including municipal and regional planning entities.

The law requires the office to make recommendations in coordination with state agencies that manage programs and grant funds across the State supporting community planning and technical assistance and to make recommendations regarding budget and staffing matters in consultation with the Department of Administration and Financial Services. The office must submit a report with regard to the review and consultation that includes proposed legislation and financial and staffing implications of the recommendations to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government and the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs by December 6, 2023.

LD 1939 An Act to Amend the Membership of the Maine-Canadian Legislative Advisory Commission and the New England and Eastern Canada Legislative Commission

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 415 makes the following changes to the membership of the Maine-Canadian Legislative Advisory Commission and the New England and Eastern Canada Legislative Commission.

- 1. It increases the membership of the Maine-Canadian Legislative Advisory Commission from eight members to 12 members.
- 2. It increases the membership of the New England and Eastern Canada Legislative Commission from four members from Maine to eight members from Maine.
- 3. It requires the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House to appoint legislative members to the Maine-Canadian Legislative Advisory Commission equally from the two parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature.

Public Law 2023, chapter 415 was enacted as an emergency effective July 19, 2023.
