LD 841 Resolve, to Study the Delivery of Emergency Medical Services to and Ferry Service Effects on Unbridged Island Communities in the State

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2025, chapter 93 directs the Department of Public Safety, Maine Emergency Medical Services to convene a working group to study the delivery of emergency medical services to and ferry service implications on unbridged island communities in the State. The department is required by January 1, 2026 to submit a report on its study to the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation and the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety. Either committees may submit legislation based on the report to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.

Resolve 2025, chapter 93 was finally passed as an emergency measure effective June 20, 2025.

LD 930 An Act to Amend the Law Governing Items Identified as Prison Contraband

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2025, chapter 355 amends the laws governing prison contraband as follows. The law provides that a person commits a class C crime if the person intentionally obtains, possesses or makes electronic prison contraband that is intended to commit a separate crime. A person commits a class D crime if the person intentionally obtains, possesses or makes electronic prison contraband that is not intended to be used to commit a separate crime. The law also provides that a person commits a class D crime if the person traffics prison contraband that is an unauthorized vaping device.

LD 931 An Act to Amend the Law Allowing Individuals Subject to Pretrial or Presentence Incarceration to Be Credited Time for Participation in Work Projects Within a Jail

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2025, chapter 341 provides that an inmate who is detained at a county jail or regional jail pretrial or presentence and who voluntarily participates in work projects within the jail is eligible to have the inmate's sentence to the jail prorated at the rate of up to one day removed from the sentence for every 16 hours of participation in the work project.
