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STOP TRANSPORTATION FUND CUTS

As some you know, The Governor's Budget reduction plan for Maine residents results in Mainecare Transportation Funding Program losing up to \$1 Million dollars. As well as a reduction of close to \$2 Million dollars from the Federal matching Medicaid fund.

If these reductions take place, Full services transportation providers, such as Western Maine Transportation, and Community Concepts Transportation Programs would be forced to close their doors. There are more than 40,000 children, elderly, and disabled residents in Maine that depend on these programs everyday. Some people going to high risk appointment like Cancer Treatment Clinics, and Dialysis. Children being transported to childcare facilities, Child Development services, Mental Health Services for troubled youths and children. There have been over 375,000 hours donated by volunteer drivers to transport residents to and from appointments, and all they ask is reimbursement of fuel.

What most of the Politicians in Maine seem not to understand is that not all of Maine residents are fortunate financially. Most of them are working class people with large families and not always enough money to support their growing families hopes for the future. These people don't always like to but at some point through it all they have to ask for help. And have to be reassured that when it is needed the help will be here. A lot of people have to depend on programs like Western Maine Transportation and/or Community Concepts Transportation to keep their lives on track, others use them as devices to help them through hard times till they can get things straightened back out as normal as their lives and be expected to be in the long run. Without these programs they would not be able to keep up with Doctor appointments, Therapy appointments, or even visitation with their children. If by some chance the Department of Human Services, has taken their children till they can make their home and or environment a safer place for the children to be brought up in. DHS to whom also use transportation programs in everyday work environments transporting children in the custody of Human Services back and forth between Foster Homes and visitation facilities so that the transition between foster homes and parents' homes are not as trying on the child's or the parents' mind.

If they pass this reduction in the State of Maine Budget, many of Maine residents will be without transportation that has always been offered to them in case of emergency or low income families. Maine is supposed to be a great place to work, live, and raise a family. But how are we to teach our children the right things to do in life, if we do not first teach them that we have to help our less fortunate residents as well as our wealthier more prominent ones.

If indeed, The State of Maine, passes this reduction. They will be out of compliance with Federal Mandate to assure non-emergency medical transportation for all Mainecare recipients.

In closing Please sign this Petition to Stop Reductions in Maine Transportation Funds..

Maybe you or someone you know has had to call upon these services in a great time of need. What would have happened if the Program was not available at the time when it was needed???

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

Governor Baldacci:

I've always considered myself to be part of the "silent majority" but because of information received pertaining to the vote on the upcoming State budget, I feel I must express my sentiments.

As a senior citizen I am concerned that funds will not be available to cover the costs of rides from such institutions as Community Concepts to assist in meeting medical related appointments. I am a heart patient so my life depends on meeting medical appointments and without transportation services I may no longer be able to meet these very important appointments.

If the current budget is approved, there will be many others like me with the same life threatening situation. I strongly feel that if this budget is allowed to pass as written that in the long run it will cost the State even more dollars then it would currently be saving. This would be due to increased emergency medical services or increasingly expensive medical treatments due to lack of on-going medical diagnosis and normal treatments.

If you are for a drug cost reducing plan for Maine then, this begs the question - how do we get to any medical service to even get the prescription? For several years now Maine has promoted the idea of "Preventative Care" such as quitting smoking, breast examinations, etc. These actions will stop due to lack of transportation.

I firmly believe that the majority of persons requiring transportation reside in areas of the state where public transportation is not available. Where there are "Van Services" for rural and other areas there is no way any of these services can be flexible enough to meet the needs of everyone who requires rides for medical appointments, or other mandated appointments for that matter. I also believe that the fast becoming majority (if not already a fact) are indeed seniors and elderly who are also tax paying voters.

This budget as written may not affect those residents from Bangor, Lewiston/Auburn or Portland but, they are not the majority of the State as a whole. The majority has no hourly scheduled public transportation. Besides, many more can not get on or off of public transports without "special equipment".

Please, Mr. Baldacci, use foresight. Look ahead, to save us money and to save our lives!


Dear Governor Baldacci:

It was very disturbing news to hear that you may be considering a reduction of \$1 million dollars for MaineCare transportation funding. The reduction of \$1 million to the MaineCare transportation funding will actually mean a reduction of a total of \$3 million dollars, because of the \$2 million of matching federal funds. How can Maine afford such a reduction?

There are over 44,000 people that rely on this transportation in order to receive services vital to their well-being. There are children, elderly, and thousands of others living on very meager amounts of money who use the transportation services for medical appointments, such as dialysis, cancer treatments, mental health, and dental, as well as child care. If the transportation to these crucial appointments is eliminated or reduced, these individuals will have a choice of eating or paying for taxi service, which is not always available in rural Western Maine. Do you truly want to be the Governor that makes people choose between eating and cancer treatments?

I strongly urge you to reconsider reducing the MaineCare transportation funding. Maine citizens simply can not afford this reduction.

The state of Maine benefits from in-kind hours provided by volunteer drivers. The reduction of MaineCare funding would jeopardize the over 375,000 hours donated by volunteers.

Dear Governor Baldacci:

I am writing concerning the rides program at Community at Community Concepts in Market Square, South Paris.

I have heard several versions of what will happen to that program under the budget the legislature has just passed. Everyone who has spoken to me about this has given me a different version of it. Of course, each one is the true version. Needless to say, there will be some changes regarding this service.

Whatever the changes are that will be made, may I put in my two cents worth? I am an 80 year old woman who depends upon this service to be able to keep my medical appointments. I have no car and will not have a car at any time in the future. I ran out of money in 1996 and thus needed to go on Medicaid, now, I believe called MaineCare. My absolutely total income is \$663.00 per month. I received a \$9.00 increase in my Social Security check this year. But my rent was raised by \$4.00 and \$12.00 in food stamps was taken away, so I am operating this year on \$7.00 per month less than last year. There is no public transportation in this area, and my family members all work and cannot take time off work to take me to my doctor's appointments. In my physical condition, it is absolutely imperative that I be able to keep these appointments.



I do understand that drastic measures have to be taken in order to get this state back on its feet, but let's not make the elderly and poor suffer any more than is necessary.



Dear Governor Baldacci,

My name is Michelle Cross, and I am a Family Service Worker at Bridge Crossing. We are a residential treatment facility located in Bridgton that serves latency-age children in need of a staff intensive, structured setting. My role within the program is to provide families with intensive home based services in working towards reunification with their children.

A large part of the reunification process is allowing the children and their respective families to spend as much time together as possible, first within our program, then eventually within their homes. Families also attend a variety of treatment meetings, PET meetings, and parent educational / support groups throughout the time a child is at Bridge Crossing. In order for many of these things to happen, we rely heavily on Community Concepts to transport both our residents and their family members.

We have worked closely with Community Concepts for nearly 5 years now, specifically Roberta and Charlotte, in setting up the many rides needed on a weekly basis. During any given week, we set up **at least 15 to 20 rides a week**. This translates to **well over 1000 rides a year** that are necessary and crucial in the treatment of our residents. Community Concepts has proved to be an invaluable resource to our program, and they have gone above and beyond the call of duty. Often we have set up rides at a moment's notice, and they have always accommodated our needs. Many drivers have been willing to transport both children and their parents on important family holidays such as Easter and Christmas.

Please do not consider cutting the funding that this wonderful and giving agency relies on to carry out their operations. Our agency is only a small representation of the many who receive transportation services, and doing so would be detrimental to many of the good things that are happening in the state of Maine.

Please feel free to contact me if I can do anything further to ensure that transportation funding does not get cut. Thank you.


Honorable John Baldacci:

It has been my personal and professional experience that the people of rural Maine need the transportation program that you are in the process of dismantling. This program provides transportation for the elderly, the disabled, DHS and Medicaid clients needing rides to doctor's appointments, to see children in danger, etc. As a DHS protective investigator and a rehabilitation counselor for Voc Rehab, (division for blind and visually impaired), I saw first hand how important it was for my clients and their families and children, and for consumers of rehabilitation services to have access to their service providers. The Western Maine Transportation Program fulfills that need.

For me personally, the need for transportation became critical for my husband when he became a dialysis patient in 2001. Community Concepts Transportation Division provided door-to-door transportation for my husband from Bethel to Lewiston, from November 2001 through Sept. 2002. They also drove him to all his many doctors' appointments, hospital visits for surgery, and for all his numerous lab tests and procedures. When my husband's Medicaid was suddenly and inexplicably terminated in June 2002, Community Concepts assured me that my husband John would continue to be able to go to his dialysis three times a week and to whatever medical appointment he needed. I was unable to provide any transportation because I am blind. If it wasn't for Community Concepts, I feel very strongly my husband would not have lived as long as he did. He died on Sept 24, 2002.

We, who live in the State of Maine, live in a rural area where the need for connecting people to services is vital to survival. Without assistance of agencies like Community Concepts and Western Maine Transportation, this administration is putting people potentially in crisis and at risk of health emergencies. We're trampling on the spirit of volunteerism and losing huge amounts of federal money and in kind services from the fabulous volunteers that participate in providing these services. They drive hundreds of miles each week. This is an example of penny wise and pound-foolish reductions in services. Please make every effort to reconsider your recommendations for the elimination of transportation funds for these programs.

Last year, after giving birth to my third child, I was diagnosed with End Stage Renal Failure and Gastric Lymphoma. Needless to say the last year has been very difficult for my family. My sixteen year old daughter, and fourteen year old son have had to take great strides into maturity in order to help their father care for me and their baby sister. Doctors appointments, surgeries, dialysis and Chemotherapy have resulted in multiple trips per week from South Paris to Auburn/Lewiston. There was no way for my husband to get all of these days off from work, at least not if we intended to continue paying bills. If we had not been able to utilize the Community Conspire Ride Program, I don't know how I would have made it all of my necessary treatments. I continue to depend on the program in order to go to dialysis three days a week. There are also many elderly individuals at the dialysis center who depend on the Community drivers to get them to their treatments. This program is wonderful, and vital to those of us who cannot drive ourselves. I understand that there

is only so much money to go around. But cutting this program will result in potentially serious health issues for many people here in Maine. (Especially the elderly.) I sincerely hope there is a way to keep this program intact.
