Part II Public Hearing Testimony of Commissioner Roland D. Martin May 5, 2003

Senator Cathcart; Representative Brannigan Members of the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs

Senator Bryant; Representative Dunlap Members of the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife

My name is Danny Martin, Commissioner of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and I am pleased to present our Part II budget to you today.

On a positive note it pleases me to say that our part II budget does not request any new general fund dollars. We are requesting, however, some minor changes and transfers.

The first item is in Part A, on page 51 of the proof that we received last Friday. This involves the transfer of federal funds from all other to personal services to fund a limited period contractual position to manage and implement the Department's MOSES system. This limited period position will be abolished at the end of FY 04.

The second item is contained in Part B of the bill (page 81 of the proof) and involves self-funded reclassifications. Would you like me to go into the details of those reclassifications?

If yes...

Administrative Services: Provides for the self-funding of two Account Clerk positions to Accounting Tech positions and one Payroll Tech to Personnel Assistant. Transferring <u>all other to personal services</u> funds the reclasses.

Fisheries and Hatcheries: Provides for the self-funding of seventeen Fish Culturist positions as part of an overall range change of this classification approved by the Bureau of Human Resources. Transferring all other to personal services funds the range changes.

Licensing Services: Provides for the self-funding of four Data Entry and two Clerk II positions to Clerk Typist III positions. Transferring <u>all other</u> to <u>personal services</u> funds the reclasses.

If no...

Finally, the last piece of our Part II budget request is in Part C of the bill on page C-25 of the proof. This action provides for the transfer of 2 Biologist I positions to dedicated funds and 2 Biology Specialist positions to federal funding within the Fisheries and Hatcheries Operations program. This action corrects an error in the Part I budget by moving positions to their proper accounts.

Again, these transfer do not require additional general fund dollars.

Testimony in Opposition to the Part II Budget De-allocation for the Department of Inland Fisheries & Wildlife Landowner Relations Office

Presented by Bob Meyers, Executive Director

The Maine Snowmobile Association represents 32,000 snowmobilers and 2,200 businesses who belong to 289 snowmobile clubs statewide. Our members maintain 13,000 miles of snowmobile trails that are the infrastructure of an industry that has an annual economic impact of \$300 million per year and provides the full-time equivalent of over 3,200 jobs.

Maine people are fortunate to be able to enjoy a wide range of outdoor recreation activities. In addition to the personal benefits these activities impart, the combined activities are a billion dollar plus industry for our state, generating thousands of jobs in rural areas and millions of dollars in tax revenues every year. Over 95% of the land these activities take place on are privately owned.

The Landowner Relations Office was created in 1995 and since that time a very small staff consisting of a Sergeant from the Warden Service and a secretary have performed a vital role in providing advocacy for both outdoorspeople and landowners, mediated conflicts and most importantly actively encouraged respectful public access to private land. Project Landshare, which was administered by the Landowner Relations Office enrolled over eight million acres of private land that are open for public access.

As you know, the budget for the Department of Inland Fisheries & Wildlife has already been cut to the bone. What's done is done, but you are no longer looking at programs that could even remotely be considered luxuries. The Landowner Relations Program is vital to continued outdoor recreation in Maine and we urge you to find the money to properly fund it.

My name is Michael Rovella. I am the legislative representative for the Maine Bowhunters Association. The board of directors asked that I come before you in hope that you will amend the Part 2 budget to retain the position of Landowner Relations Coordinator. This position is vital to the link between all Maine landowners and sportsman. I have personally traveled the length of the State of Maine with the previous coordinator Dave Peppard before his retirement. All landowner issues were addressed at town meetings and the outcome is always positive. Positive, because the landowner and the sportsman are united behind one individual and the flow of information is consistent. Eleven days from today I take the chair position on the Sportsman/Forest Landowners Alliance. An alliance that at each meeting has the landowner coordinator present to clarify any landowner concerns and stop any action that would damage relations between the parties involved. This position is one of the most important on the table, for the Department of Inland Fisheries and its communication to landowners. To remove the nucleus of the landowner program would be a serious mistake under any circumstances, but with the current ATV upheaval it would be disastrous. Every aspect of land use in our state would be affected and affected adversely. Maine with all of its public lands cannot afford to be without the position of Landowner Coordinator. We ask again for your consideration to amend the part 2 budget, and protect Maine's landowners.

Report back on Part 2 Budget: IFW

The Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Committee and its budget sub-committee have carefully reviewed the Part 2 Budget proposals for funding current services at the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. The committee voted unanimously to accept the Governor's proposal with the following recommendations:

- 1. Remove Part H from the budget in its entirety. The committee expressed a strong desire to maintain the current structure of the Atlantic Salmon Commission to insure the Commission can continue to effectively and efficiently pursue its mission;
- 2. Repeal of section L-1 of Public Law 2003, c. 20. This section allows the commissioner to adjust fees based on the consumer price index. The committee strongly feels that the adjustments of fees is a matter of public policy and should remain completely under the guidance of this committee;
- 3. Restore staffing for the Landowner's Relation Program. This funding is critical to the operation of the Landowner's Relation Program and is funded from "all other" and will not result in a net cost to the General Fund. The language for this proposal is attached to this letter as Attachment A;

- 4. Provide funding for the promotion of the Supersport program. The language for this proposal is attached to this letter as Attachment A. This program supports the Landowners Relation Program; and
- 5. Increase the fee for being a Supersport from \$15 to \$20 to further support landowner relations. The language for this adjustment is attached to this letter as Attachment A.
- 6. In the Draft Proposal Part C, there is an initiative to provide for one permanent part-time Public Service Executive position in the Atlantic Salmon Commission at a cost of \$7,646 in FY 03-04 and \$9,649 in FY 04-05. The committee does not support this position.

Thank you for your consideration of our recommendations.
